Guidelines for submitting paper for Partap IPDA International Conference 2025

Page setup

Margins: 1 Inch on all sides.

Font Size and Type: 12-pt. Times New Roman

Line Spacing: Single space throughout the paper, including the title page, abstract, body of the document, references, appendices, footnotes, tables and figures.

Alignment: Justified, Orientation: Portrait, Page size: A4

Title: 14 pts, uppercase bolded and centered, name and personal information (academic title, institutional affiliation, e-mail address and contact number) should be placed under the title.

Abstract: (300-500 words) should include the following: objectives, tools, method, results and conclusion. The abstract must be written in Times New Roman, Font size 10 and Italic.

Keywords: Up to 3 key words, Times New Roman, Font size 10 bolded and Italic.

Structure of the Article: The papers should be structured in title and subtitle sections including Introduction, Objectives, Method, Result & Discussion, Conclusions and Implications.

References and Footnotes: References should follow the referencing style used by the American Psychological Association (APA) Seventh Edition in alphabetical order. For help you can visit. http://www.apastyle.org/ All sources cited in the paper must be included in the reference section.

Word Count: Maximum 2500-3500 words including tables, figures, references etc.
